

# **A Study of the Prophets**

## **OT Survey Lesson 122--Isaiah 14:29-23:18**

**Introduction:** This rather large section is made up of prophecies of Isaiah concerning various nations with whom Israel had contact. In them we can see both the threat of judgment against them for their sins, and the hope of the salvation even of the Gentile peoples.

**Lesson aim:** To show that God is the Lord of all nations and is concerned about both their conduct and their salvation.

### **Judgment on Philistia--Isaiah 14:29-32**

1. Why was Philistia urged not to rejoice? (v. 29)
2. What answer would be given to the messenger of the nations? (v. 32)

### **Judgment on Moab--Isaiah 15:1-16:14**

1. What thing in particular does Isaiah say the Moabites will be doing? (v. 1-9)
2. Isaiah says that Moab's only hope is to find refuge in Judah and its king. Describe this king (v. 5) Who might this be?
3. Would you think that Moab listened to Isaiah's advice? (v. 6-13)

### **God's judgment on Damascus--Isaiah 17:1-14**

1. What does God predict is to happen to Damascus and Ephraim? (v. 1-3)
2. Why does Isaiah suggest Israel has been brought to "leaness"? (v. 10)

### **God's judgment on Ethiopia--Isaiah 18:1-7**

1. What are the Ethiopians pictured as doing in response to God's defeat of the Assyrians? (v. 7)

## **God's judgment on Egypt--Isaiah 19:1-20:6**

1. List some of the things God threatens to do to Egypt? (v. 1-17)
2. Make a list of some of the promises of the latter part of the chapter? (v. 18-25) How do you think these were fulfilled?
3. What does God predict about Egypt in chapter 20?

## **God's judgment of Babylon, Edom and Arabia--Isaiah 21:1-17**

1. Who does God predict will bring destruction on Babylon? (v. 2) What will this cause the watchman to cry out? (v. 9)
2. What are the messages of Isaiah concerning Edom and Arabia?

## **The oracle concerning the vally of vision (Concerning Judah)-- Isaiah 22:1-25**

1. Isaiah shows that Israel had not listened to God's warnings. What did they say? (v. 13) Would God forgive them for this? (v. 14)
2. The second half of the prophecy is directed toward what man? (v. 15) Who did God say would take his place? (v. 20)

## **God's judgment on Tyre--Isaiah 23:1-18**

1. What does God predict in v. 1-7? Who is behind this? (v. 9) For how long will Tyre stand desolate? (v. 15)
