A Study of the Prophets O.T. Survey Lesson 152--Jeremiah 19:1-20:18

Introduction: In this section, Jeremiah, by the symbolic breaking of a jar, indicates the breaking of Judah by the Babylonians. The message caused Pashur the priest to put Jeremiah in stocks for a day where he was made a laughingstock by the people.

Lesson aim: To convey the idea that those who speak God's word must be willing to bear whatever reproach it may bring.

Judah portrayed as a broken jar--19:1-15

- 1. What did the Lord command Jeremiah to do in preparation for his next message? Where was he to go to deliver the message? (v. 1-2)
- 2. God said Jeremiah's message would cause the ears of the people to do what? (v. 3)
- 3. For what reasons did God say Tophet's name would be changed to the valley of slaughter? (v. 4-6)
- 4. What things would happen to the people when God's judgment came? (v. 7-9)
- 5. What did Jeremiah do with the jar he had brought to the valley? (v. 10) How did Jeremiah say Judah would be like that jar? (v. 11-13)
- 6. Where did Jeremiah go after delivering this message? (v. 14) What did he say there? (v. 15)

Jeremiah is persecuted for his message of judgment upon Judah--Jeremiah 20:1-18

- 1. What did Pashur the priest do when he heard the prophecy of Jeremiah? (v. 1-2)
- 2. What name did Jeremiah say God had given Pashur? (v. 3) What does it mean? (Note the translation in the margin of your Bible)
- 3. What did Jeremiah say would happen to Pashur's country? (v. 4) Its wealth? (v. 5) Pashur and his family and friends? (v. 6)
- 4. How does Jeremiah describe his relation with the Lord? (v. 7) How do the people treat him? (v. 7)
- 5.0f what did Jeremiah speak each time he opened his mouth? (v. 8) What resulted for him? (v. 8)
- 6. What did Jeremiah say the word of God was like when he held it within himself? (v. 9)
- 7. What had Jeremiah heard his enemies saying? (v. 10) What did Jeremiah expect God to do? (v. 11-12)
- 8. What did Jeremiah say upon deliverance from Pashur's mistreatment? (v. 13)
- 9. Perhaps the words of v. 14-18 were spoken later when Jeremiah fell again into the anguish of knowing that his message to Judah had been given in vain. What did Jeremiah curse? Why? (v. 14-18)
