Growing in Knowledge of the Word



The Obligation to Grow in Knowledge

As disciples, we all have the obligation and privilege of getting to know God and His will better through study of His revelation. Peter, warning of the dangers presented by false teachers, encouraged the saints to "grow in the grace and knowledge of Jesus Christ" as a way of avoiding being misled (2 Peter 3:18). Paul urged Timothy, "Be diligent to present yourself approved to God as a workman who does not need to be ashamed, handling accurately the word of truth" (2 Tim. 2:15). There are a number of ways by which we may put these exhortations into practice in our personal lives.

Develop a Personal Study Routine!

There is no substitute for personal encounter with the word of God. The psalm collection is introduced by the presentation of the "blessed" man. The psalmist says about him, "But

his delight is in the Law of the Lord; and in His law he meditates day and night." (Ps. 1:2).

I encourage you to arrange for yourself a regular time of Bible study each day. Use it as a time to get more familiar with the whole Bible, to search out answers to personal questions you may have about God's will, and to increase your confidence in the inspiration and benefit of the Scriptures in guiding your life.

Arrange a Home Bible Study!

If you are a new Christian, it would be especially helpful to have someone to orient you to the life of a disciple, perhaps giving you a big picture view of the Bible or going over fundamental teachings that all Christians should know. You can ask questions without feeling embarrassed by what you may not know, and you can hear a more thorough discussion of questions that you may have. Your preacher, along with others in the congregation, are eager and willing to provide this kind of study that will give you a "jump start" in your Christian life.

Attend the Church-Provided Studies!

The church seeks to provide ample opportunities for all its members to grow through providing
